OXNARD COLLEGE is a fully accredited public community college providing quality academic and career programs since 1975. Ideally situated on California's Central Coast and within two miles of Ventura County beaches, Oxnard College was founded on 118 acres in south Oxnard and is experiencing major reconstruction as part of the Measure S Bond-funded expansion of the Ventura County Community College District. Admission to the college is open to any adult who is able to profit from instruction and opportunities for enrichment. High School juniors and seniors may also attend Oxnard College concurrently, tuition free. Oxnard College offers 18 certificate programs, 17 Associate degrees for transfer and 37 Associate degrees with classes in over 60 disciplines. PROGRAMS & OPPORTUNITIES

ASSOCIATE DEGREES FOR TRANSFER

Oxnard College offers 18 Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT). Students earning an ADT are guaranteed transfer admission to the California State University system. At the present time, Oxnard College offers ADTs in the following subjects: Anthropology; Business Administration; Communication Studies; Early Childhood Education; Economics; English; Film, Television and Electronic Media; Geography; History; Kinesiology; Mathematics; Philosophy; Physics; Political Science; Psychology; Sociology; Spanish; Studio Arts.

ATHLETICS The Oxnard College Condors compete in the highly competitive Western State Conference and have won titles in Men's Baseball, Soccer, and Cross Country since the 1980s. 1. APPLY

- Apply online at Oxnardcollege.edu/apply
- Read your confirmation email
- Use the link in email to set up your **MyVCCCD** portal within 10 days.

2. FINANCIAL AID

- Complete the FAFSA to receive money for books at fafsa.ed.gov
- AB540 /Dream Act students apply at dream.csac.ca.gov
- Complete the BOG Fee Waiver to waive enrollment fee through your student portal.

3. ASSESSMENT

- Prepare for the assessment using study guides at: oxnardcollege.edu/assessment
- Walk-ins welcome on Monday-Friday.
- Must have student number (from Oxnard College) and photo ID

4. ORIENTATION AND EDUCATIONAL PLAN

- All new students must complete the orientation and an educational plan
- On-line orientation (my.vcccd.edu) or in person at 805-986-5907
- Bring assessment scores and transcripts
- First semester educational plan will be completed with a Counselor (during in-person orientation)
