Introduction

For the students whose educational goals include transferring to a California public institution, such as the California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC), the **Articulation System Stimulating Interinstitutional Student Transfer** (ASSIST) is available. ASSIST is an online student-transfer information system that shows how course credits earned at one public California college or university can be applied when transferred to another. It's a valuable resource for our students, staff and faculty to use as it displays articulation agreements between 112 California Community Colleges (CCC) with the California public four-year institutions (23 campuses of the CSU and 10 campuses of the UC). However, ASSIST does not provide and maintain articulation agreements for private, independent and out-of-state colleges/universities.

Currently, Moorpark College does not have an Articulation website or a central location to store articulation agreements from private and independent institutions. Hard copies of the agreements are often stored in the Articulation office and various counselor offices throughout the campus. As our student population continues to grow and with only 13 full-time counselors to serve approximately 15,000 students, it is critical that current and accurate transfer information be readily available and accessible for both California and non-California transfer students.

Preparation Activities for project

My sabbatical proposal included that I enroll and complete a Webpage Design course (CIS M30) to obtain the necessary computer and technology skills needed for the development and maintenance of the webpage. However, after meeting with Betsy Wagner, MC's former instructional technologist I learned that the district uses the "OmniUpdate" for its website development and maintenance and so the course would be unnecessary. Instead, I was referred to work with Victory Kitamura at the District Office. Victory was of a

tremendous help as he took me through the step-by-step process of developing and designing the webpage using the OmniUpdate.

In addition to meeting with Victory, I also spent countless hours looking through various California Community College Articulation websites for content and design ideas. Some of the websites visited: American River College, College of the Sequoias, Consumnes River College, City College of San Francisco, Fullerton College, Grossmont College, Lake Tahoe Community College, Laney College, Las Positas College, Napa Valley College, Orange Coast College, Pasadena College, Sacramento City College, Santa Monica College and Santa Barbara College.

Final product

Moorpark College now has a “one-stop” Articulation website where articulation and curriculum related information is readily available online for our students, counselors and faculty. The webpage is now live and active and can be accessed at

The website went live on September 1, 2010 and was introduced to the counseling staff at its’ September 21st, 2010 department meeting. The website was also introduced to the Curriculum Committee at its’ November 9, 2010 meeting. I believe the website was also used as a resource for the Accreditation team visit as I was asked to provide the web link in preparation of the visit.

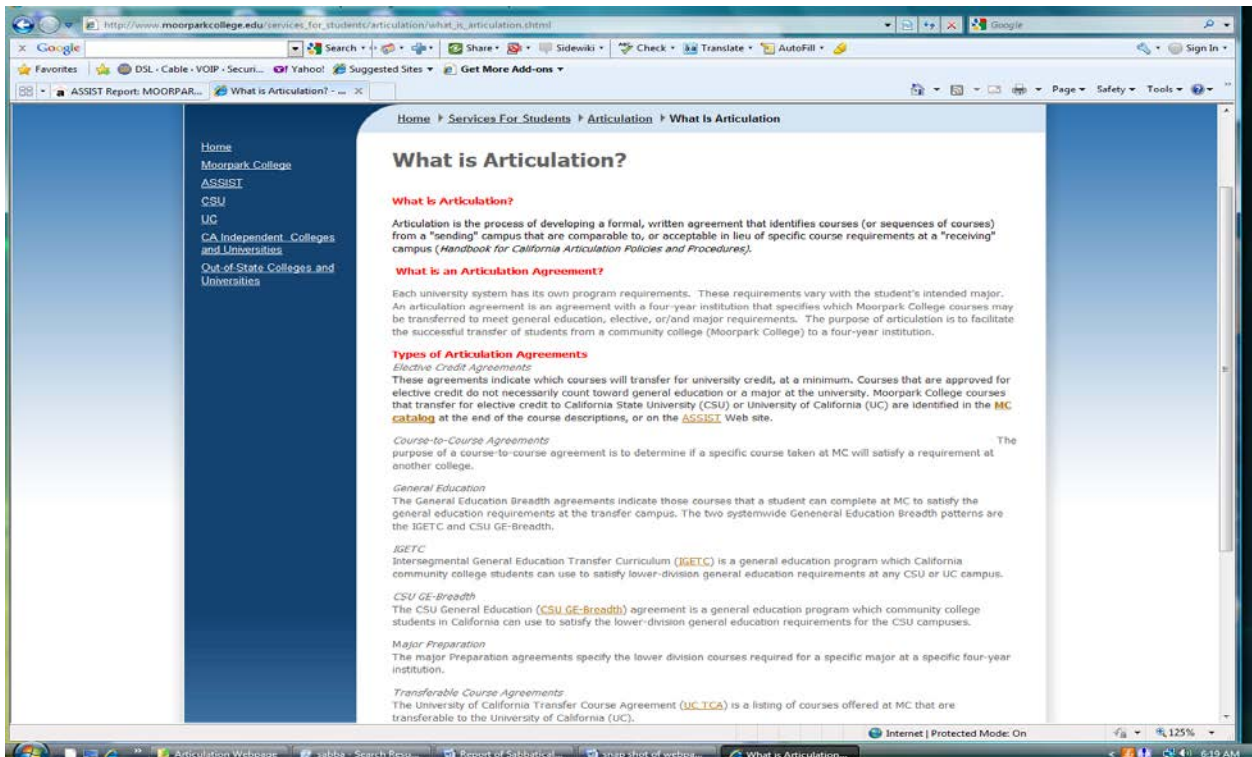
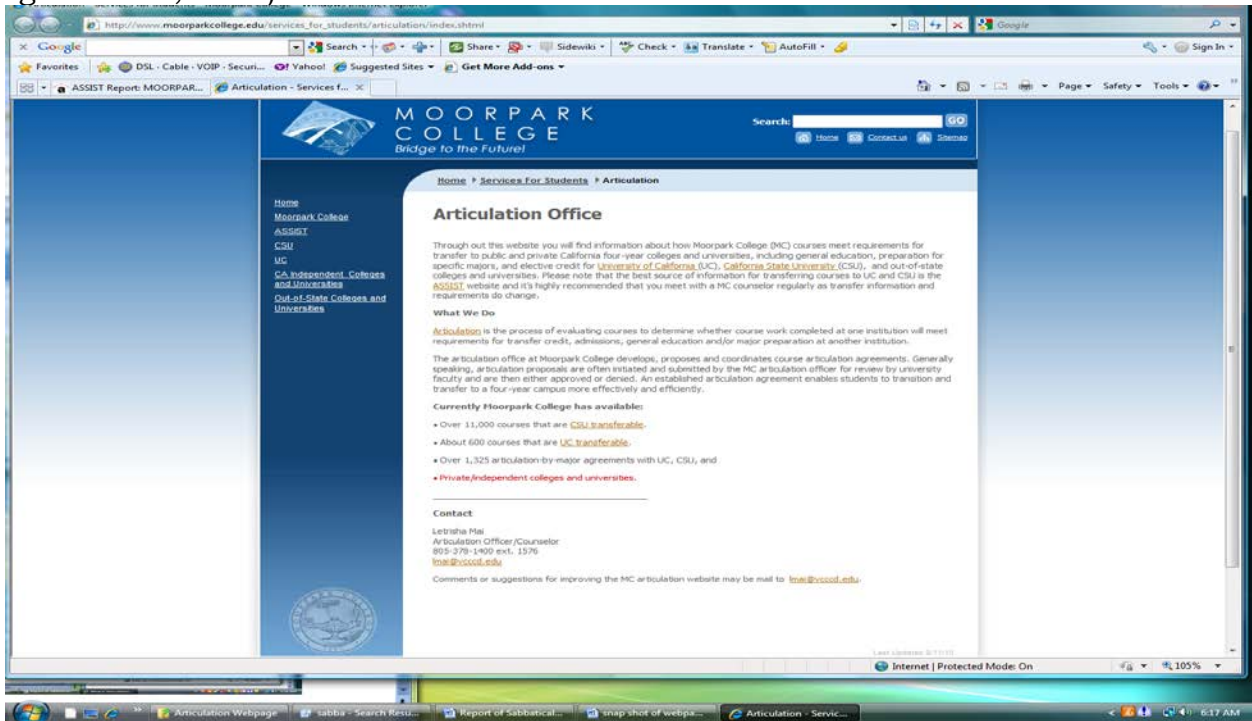
Conclusion

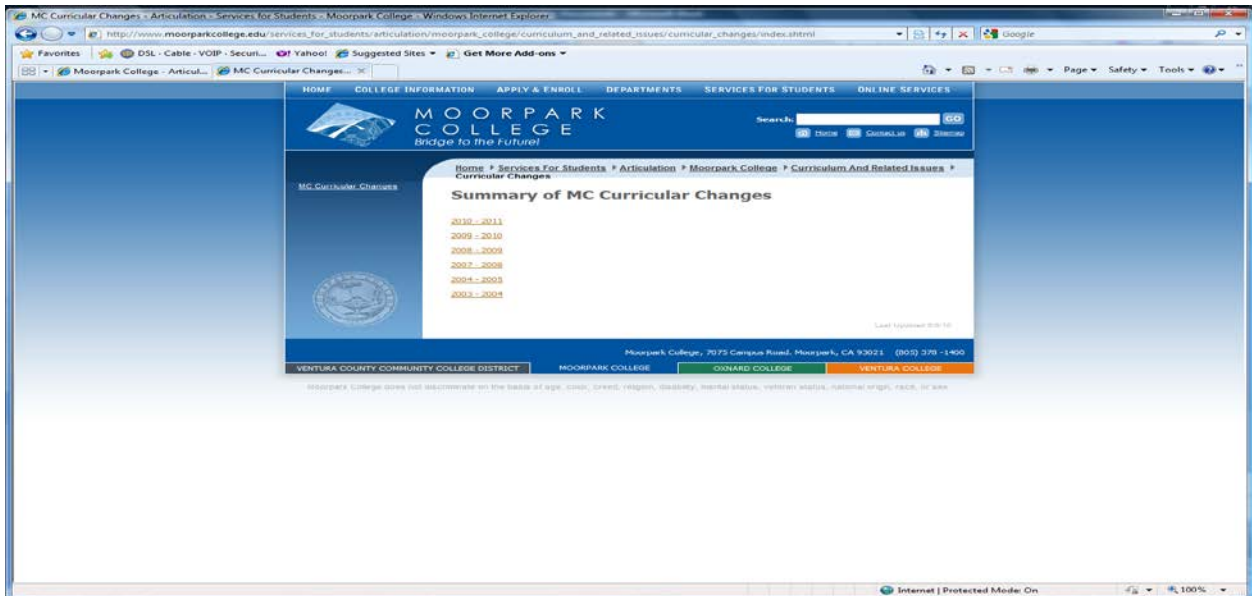

How to Find Comparable Courses and Course Outlines of Record online

Using ASSIST:

1. Log onto <http://info.assist.org> (note: there's no www.).
2. Under DATABASE, select ASSIST Maintenance Report.
3. Sign in by using "MOORPARKFAC" as the user name and "ALMOND" as the password.
4. Click on "Course Search" option (on left handside).
5. Select the institution(s) that you want to obtain the information from - i.e., CCCs, CSUs or/and UCs).
6. Type in the course title or key terminology if you do not have a title.
7. Continue filling in the information as requested or select from the options given.
8. Click on the "Continue" button at the bottom to start the search. It might take a few minutes to run the report.

Once the report is done, you should see a list of comparable courses (by title or key terminology) available.

In addition to finding comparable courses by title or key terminology, some of the California Community Colleges will also have their course outlines on this database. If a course outline is available, you will see "OSCAR (pdf)" to the right of the course. To view the course outline, click on "PDF" (date) icon.

Using CurricUNET

CurricUNET provides the ability to search the CurricUNET database for course outlines from participating CurricUNET colleges.

1. Using Internet Explorer, go to [curricunet.com/college name](http://www.curricunet.com/college name) -for example, <http://www.curricunet.com/moorpark> or <http://www.curricunet.com/oxnard>
2. On the left handside, under "Search" click on "Course" or "Program"
3. The Course Status is default to "All" but you can select from any option given.
4. Using the drop down menu, select the discipline that you want and either click on the "OK" button to see all course outlines available for that discipline or you can type in the course number and/or title.
5. Available course outline(s) will appear. Click on the "COR" icon to view the course outline.

Certification and Double Counting

Executive Order (E.O.) No. 107 delegates to the California Community Colleges the authority to identify transferable courses applicable to the CSU Executive Order No. 107 courses. The California Community Colleges identify courses that fulfill the General Education-Breadth requirements. Since 1982, community colleges also have been authorized to determine, using the provisions of E.O. No. 107, which community college courses that fulfill the U.S. history, constitution and American civics requirement, although production requirements vary among CSU campuses. Community colleges can ensure maximum compatibility between community college courses and CSU lower division requirements through inclusion of the certification process.

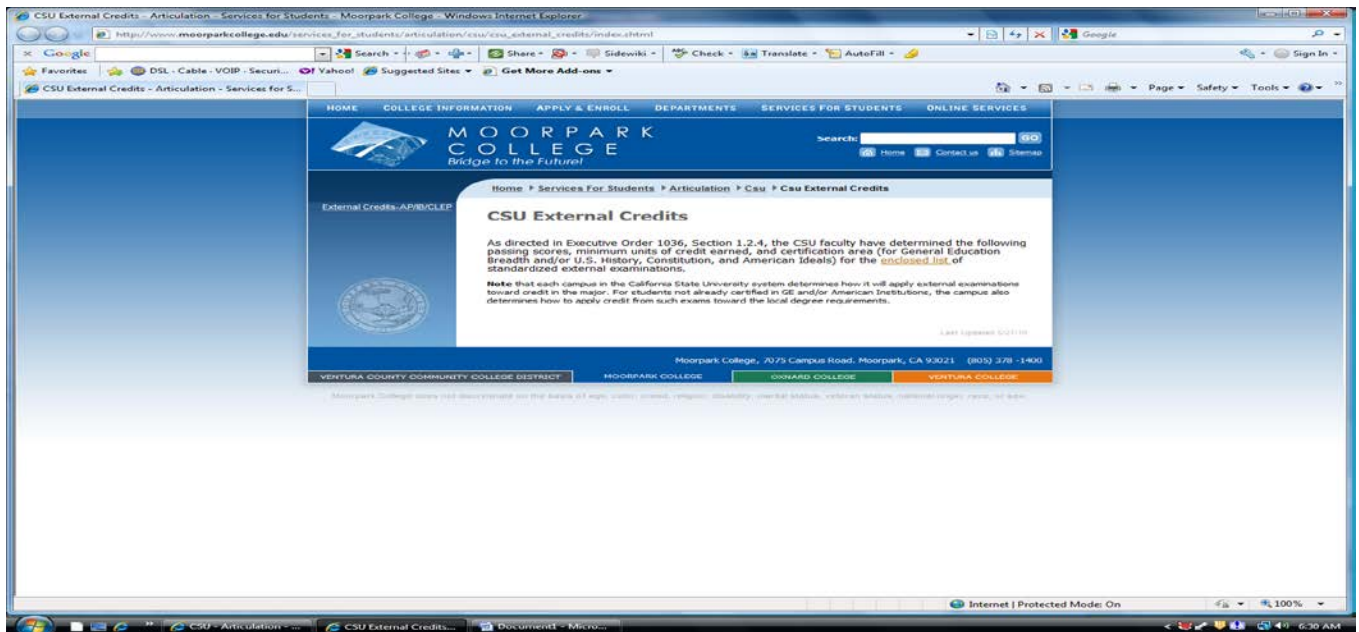
Most CSU campuses allow double counting for general education and major requirements to applicants who submit either all or partial certification. Exceptions are indicated below.

Bakersfield: Courses are not double counted. **Channel Islands:** Some double counting is permitted. **Chico:** This counting is generally not permitted for students in a specific major. **Dominate Hills:** Double counting is permitted in some majors. **Fresno:** Double counting is subject to departmental approval. A maximum of two courses may be double counted for requirements. **Fullerton:** Double counting is permitted except for **Long Beach** which allows a total of 10 units in major and GE to transfer for students not fully certified. **Los Angeles:** Courses can be double counted if articulated. **Moorpark Bay:** Double counting is subject to departmental approval. **Northridge:** Limited double counting is permitted in specific majors. **Sacramento:** Double counting is limited to one GE unit in major subject. **San Bernardino:** Double counting is permitted in major and GE to transfer in either upper or lower division. **San Diego:** Courses can be double counted if articulated. **San Francisco:** Double counting is permitted. **San Luis Obispo:** Some double counting is permitted. **San Marcos:** Some double counting is permitted in upper division GE. **San Jose:** Double counting is permitted. **San Jose State:** Some double counting is permitted.

Attached is a copy of Executive Order No. 1033, relating to California State University General Education Breadth (CSU GE Breadth) requirements.

In response to CSU Trustee initiatives on facilitating graduation and improving intersegmental transfer, the Academic Senate CSU charged the Chancellor's General Education Advisory Committee (GEAC) to study CSU general education policy, as it was previously outlined in Executive Order 595.


In a truly consultative and intersegmental process, GEAC members collected campus feedback that was informed by faculty, general education leadership, administrators of undergraduate education, directors of admissions and records, and articulation officers, among others. GEAC members, including representatives from CSU and California Community College faculty and administration, have synthesized campus recommendations in this new executive order. The structure and minimum curricular requirements remain unchanged, but the policy emphasis has moved from curricular content to what students learn through the breadth of their general education experiences.

Perhaps the most significant advancement is that this executive order identifies, for the first time, goals for CSU general education student learning outcomes, in recognition of the CSU's commitment to the quality of our educational programs. The executive order directs campuses to conduct assessments of general education learning outcomes through regular reviews of their general education courses and breadth programs.

Supporting efforts toward facilitating graduation, this revised policy emphasizes the system-level minima for required general education credits. To improve intersegmental transfer, longstanding policy has been modified to allow the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum to satisfy

GPA REQUIREMENT - IGETC courses must be completed with a grade of C or better. A grade of Credit or Pass is acceptable, providing it is equivalent to a grade of C or higher at the institution where the course was taken.

USE OF AP EXAMS - IGETC course credit may be earned for acceptable scores of 3, 4, or 5 on Advanced Placement (AP) exams. An acceptable score on an English AP exam may be used to meet the English Composition requirement, NOT the Critical Thinking/English Composition requirement. Please consult with a counselor for the list of AP credits that Moorpark College accepts.

IGETC COURSE AGREEMENTS

- Courses completed at a California Community College will be applied to the subject area in which they were listed by the institution where the work was completed. Courses completed at a U.S. regionally accredited institution that meet IGETC standards may also be used for certification.
- A single community college course may be listed in the IGETC under more than one subject area; however, it may be used only once to satisfy one IGETC subject area. The University will allow students to use the same course to count toward the IGETC as well as major requirements.

IGETC EXCEPTIONS - Students with a substantial amount of foreign coursework should be encouraged to follow the CSU General Education-Breadth program or UC campus general education program since the foreign coursework would not be a part of a student's IGETC certification.

MEETING FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (UC only)

The Foreign Language requirement for IGETC may be met in one of the following ways:

- Satisfactory completion of any MC foreign language course level 1 or higher.
- Completion of two years of the same foreign language in high school with grade of "C" or better in the last semester of the 2nd year.
- Satisfactory completion of 2 or more years of formal schooling at the 6th grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English.
- Completion of a course at a college or university with a grade of "C" or better (any course, excluding conversation courses) to be equivalent to 2 years of high school language may be used.
- Equivalent proficiency demonstrated by a minimum score of 3 on an AP exam in languages other than English.
- A score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level Exam in languages other than English.
- Satisfactory score on the SAT II Subject Test in languages other than English.

(COMPLETION OF IGETC WILL AUTOMATICALLY FULFILL THESE REQUIREMENTS.)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT IGETC

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a general education program that California Community College transfer students may use to fulfill lower-division general education requirements in either the UC or CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. The IGETC is most useful for students who want to keep their options open before making a final decision about transferring to a particular UC or CSU campus. Completion of IGETC does not guarantee admission, nor is it required for admission.

The IGETC is most advantageous for transfers who have not yet decided on a major or a campus. Once a student has identified a major, it is important for the student to work toward fulfilling any required preparatory courses, particularly in professional or "high unit" majors that select applicants on the basis of satisfaction of lower-division major requirements. It is important to note that this does not preclude a student from following the IGETC; however, the IGETC should not be chosen to the exclusion of completing any preparatory courses needed for admission.

In general, it is not advisable for transfer students preparing for "high unit" majors (at any UC campus) to use the IGETC. Students entering high unit majors, such as those in engineering and the sciences, should focus on completing required lower division major preparation courses. Majors in the sciences, for example, not only have specific science prerequisites, but have substantial mathematics requirements as well.

IGETC Certification: All UC and CSU campuses will accept full certification (completion of requirements in every area of the IGETC as meeting all of the lower division GE requirements for the baccalaureate degree. Moorpark College also provides partial certification (maximum of two courses missing to be completed after transfer). It is your responsibility to consult with a counselor at your university to find out how to complete the IGETC. You do not need to reapply for full certification from Moorpark College once you have completed the missing course(s).

Warning: you need to complete minimum UC/CSU transfer admission requirements. Therefore, if you are missing courses in IGETC Areas 1 and/or 2 you may put your admissions in jeopardy.

Exception: UC Berkeley's College of Letters & Science requires full certification of IGETC pattern of courses as selection criteria for admission into the College. Any student offered admission on the condition that they submit full IGETC completion but then submits a Partial IGETC Certification, could have their positive admission decision reversed. Berkeley will consider students who cannot complete IGETC on a case by case basis.

Students should request certification when a final transcript is requested to be sent to their choice of UC or CSU (campus where admission has been accepted), the term prior to transfer. Once certification is completed student records (transcript) will reflect the full or partial certification of IGETC completion. Schedule an appointment with a Moorpark College counselor for IGETC certification. Official transcripts of any coursework completed outside Ventura Community College District must be on file prior or accompany the certification request.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT IGETC

- 1. What is IGETC?**

IGETC stands for Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum. The IGETC is a general education pattern in which California community college transfer students can use to fulfill lower-division general education requirements for either the CSU or UC system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education requirements. Depending on the campus to which a student transfers, there may be additional non-GE lower-division graduation requirements to be met (e.g., foreign language, multi-cultural studies, American history) as well as upper division general education requirements.
- 2. Is IGETC an admission requirement?**

Yes. Completion of IGETC alone does not meet the admission requirements for either UC or CSU nor is it required for admission. In addition, completion of IGETC does not guarantee admission to a student's campus of choice. However, completion of the IGETC may improve a transfer applicant's chances for admission to a UC campus and/or program.
- 3. Is it advisable for all transfer students to follow IGETC?**

Yes. Some students may be better served by taking courses which fulfill the CSU General Education requirements or those of the UC campus or college to which they plan to transfer. IGETC will be most useful to students who want to keep their options open before making a final decision about transferring to a particular CSU or UC campus. Once a student has identified a major, it is important for the student to work toward fulfilling any required preparatory courses, particularly in professional or "high unit" majors that select applicants on the basis of satisfaction of lower-division major requirements. We encourage you to discuss your transfer plan with a counselor to help you decide if following IGETC is the best option for you.
- 4. Must the entire IGETC pattern be completed prior to transfer?**

*Yes. It is more possible to receive "partial certification" of IGETC when all but two courses on the IGETC pattern have been completed. However, students should consider specific university admissions policies, which may require full IGETC certification or the completion of Areas 1 (English Communication) and 2 (Mathematical Concepts and Quantitative Reasoning). **NOTE: UC Berkeley's College of Letters & Science requires full certification of IGETC.***
- 5. Can coursework taken at other institutions be used to certify a student's completion of IGETC?**

Yes, courses taken at other regionally accredited institutions can be included in the IGETC however there are stipulations. Moorpark College (MC) will certify courses taken at other regionally accredited colleges and universities under the following conditions: MC will place courses taken at other California community colleges in the IGETC categories identified by the offering college. Courses must have been on that college's IGETC list when the courses were taken. Courses taken at other colleges/universities may be used on IGETC only if they are evaluated and deemed as equivalent to courses on the IGETC list for MC or another California community college.

NOTE: except for California community colleges, coursework from other institutions generally will not be used to fulfill the critical thinking/writing composition requirement (Area 1B). In addition, foreign coursework cannot be part of a student's IGETC certification. *In order to have your previous school's records evaluated for IGETC certification, schedule a counseling appointment and bring an unofficial or official transcript to your appointment. At the time you request IGETC certification, you will need to submit OFFICIAL transcripts to MC's Registration & Records Office or Counseling Office.*
- 6. Can foreign coursework be applied to the IGETC?**

*Yes. Foreign coursework may be applied to IGETC if the foreign institution has United States regional accreditation. All other foreign coursework can **NOT** be applied to IGETC. Students with substantial amount of foreign coursework at a non-US regionally accredited institution should be encouraged to follow the UC or CSU campus-specific general education pattern.*

Exception: foreign coursework completed at a non-US institution may be applied to meet the Language Other than English (LOTE) area 6 of IGETC.
- 7. Will students be required to earn a minimum grade in all courses used for IGETC certification?**

Each AP exam may be applied to one IGETC area as satisfying one course requirement, with the exception of Language other than English (LOTE).

Students who have earned credit from an AP exam should not take a comparable college course because transfer credit will not be granted for both.

There is no equivalent AP exam for Area 1B - Critical Thinking/Composition requirement.

Students earning scores of 3, 4, or 5 in the physical and biological science AP examinations earn credit toward IGETC Area 5 and meet the IGETC laboratory activity requirement.

AP exams in Biology, Chemistry or Physics B allow CCC campuses to apply 4 semester or 5 quarter units to IGETC certification. For Environmental Science, Physics C: Mechanics and Physics C: Electricity/Magnetism, 3 semester or 4 quarter units are applied for IGETC certification; therefore, students who complete these exams will be required to complete at least 4 semester or 5 quarter units to satisfy the minimum required units for Area 5.

The Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) Degree:

A maximum of thirty (30) semester units can be applied towards the Liberal Arts course requirements at the Academy of Art University.

Nine (9) units of transfer level art classes that are related to Academy of Art University majors can also be transferred as art elective units.

A maximum of thirty (30) units may be transferred in combination of Liberal Arts and Art Elective transfer awards.

Department Directors may transfer additional units based on portfolio review. These units do not count towards the 30 unit maximum mentioned above. However, a maximum of 66 units may be transferred in total towards the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree.

Courses must be reported on an official transcript and must have a record grade of "C" or higher to qualify for transfer credit.


