Launched two years ago to offer TCSPP's curriculum to a broader audience, The Chicago School's B.A. Program has expanded to a four-year degree program, and many of these students will have the opportunity to continue their post-graduate education and training at the University by enrolling in one of its many masters and doctoral-level programs.

VCCCD students will be granted admission to TCSPP's [Bachelor of Arts in Psychology Program](#) upon meeting either of the following admissions criteria: The completion of specific coursework, with a minimum grade point average, and after a course-by-course evaluation to meet General Education requirements as outlined by TCSPP; or possess a conferred Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree with a minimum GPA as established by The Chicago School. Lastly, all courses taken or degrees received must be from a regionally accredited institution. VCCCD students meeting these requirements are eligible for a 10 percent decrease in the bachelor degree tuition rate.

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“We are excited to partner with the Ventura County Community College District to offer this exciting opportunity to VCCCD students who are interested in pursuing a degree that will help improve mental health care in our communities,” said Michele Nealon-Woods, Psy.D., president, The Chicago School. “Both of our institutions are focused on meeting the needs of students by providing a comprehensive education in this discipline--one that will help them be successful in today’s increasingly competitive world.”
