Offers practical experience in theatrical lighting. Covers design, hanging and focusing of instruments, programming lighting cues and executing cues during a live performance. Does NOT apply to Associate Degree.

TTHA M902 Applied Technology for Theatrical Audio Production 0 Hours
Recommended Preparation: FTVM M40
Class Hours: 6-9 Lab
Offers practical experience in theatrical audio production. Covers design, creating, recording and mixing audio effects, running cabling for microphones and speakers, and operating multi-channel audio boards during a live production. Does NOT apply to Associate Degree.

TTHA M903 Applied Practices for Theatrical State Management 0 Hours

Recommended Preparation: TTHA M20

Class Hours: 6-9 Lab

Offers methodologies for stage management of a theatrical production. Covers blocking notation, prompt book assembly, and best practices for universal communication in a theatrical production. Does NOT apply to Associate Degree.

This course surveys professional ethics for the accounting profession in the context of ethical theory, the history of ethical thought, the nature of accounting, tax and auditing fiduciary responsibilities, the rules of accounting codes of conduct, financial statement representations and fraud, and the theoretical and practical application of ethical principles to business situations. Topics include ethical standards specific to the accounting profession, an examination of the balance between the competing interests of the accountant's roles as management consultant and reporter of financial information to third parties, and the interests of businesses, government and professional regulatory agencies and the public. *Field trips may be required.*

ADS R125	Co-Occurring Disorders II	3 Units
Prerequisites:	ADS R113

This course in co-occurring disorders is designed to give students advanced knowledge and skills in managing and treating clients with chemical dependency and other major psychiatric illnesses. It focuses on current treatment approaches, understanding medications, and how addiction counselors may interface with the professional mental health community to manage cases. This course fulfills one 3-unit skills elective of the California Association for Alcohol/Drug Educators (CAADE) and is required for the CAADE Co-Occurring Disorders Certificate. *Field trips may be required.*

FT R180	Wildland Fire Academy	7.5 Units
Prerequisites:	FT R151 and EMT R169	
Hours:	5 lecture, 7.5 lab weekly

This course provides the entry level student with the fire behavior knowledge and firefighting skills relevant to basic incident command, wildland firefighting positions, basic crew configurations, firefighter safety in wildland environments, tool, equipment and fundamental water handling, and wildland suppression strategy and tactics. Portable pumps and chainsaws are studied at length, as well as basic tools for land navigation. Leadership values and principles, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team building and ethical decision making is integrated throughout the course. Students are expected to obtain all required uniforms and safety equipment. State certification costs are the responsibility of the student. Field trips are required. Medical clearance is required. *Field trips will be required.*

This course introduces ~~advanced~~ concepts and production skills specific to narrative filmmaking, including scripting, story boarding, pre-production planning, budgeting, casting, shooting, **cinematography**, lighting, sound and editing. Students write, produce, direct and edit a personal narrative project and participate in a group narrative project. Current trends and styles in production are discussed.

*Field Trips may be required. **Transfer credit: CSU, UC. May be taken 1 time***

AP 4235 Credit by Examination –adopted July 2009. Last revised April 2017

Granting unit credit for a course by examination is based on the principle that previous experience, training, or instruction is the equivalent of a specific course taught by the college.

COURSES ELIGIBLE FOR CREDIT BY EXAMINATION:

- All courses shall be open to credit by examination unless specifically exempted by the District College.
- Academic divisions of the District Colleges determine the courses for which credit by examination may be granted. The Office of Student Learning at each District College maintains a current list of courses excluded from Credit by Examination.

DOCUMENTING CREDIT EARNED BY EXAMINATION:

- For credit earned through the credit by examination provisions, the student's academic record shall be clearly annotated to reflect that credit was earned by examination.

CREDIT BY EXAMINATION MAY BE OBTAINED BY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING METHODS:

- I. External Examinations: (Title 5 Section 55052)
 - a. Advanced Placement (AP): Students who earn scores of 3, 4 or 5 on the College Board AP Examinations taken before high school graduation will receive credit for each exam as specified in the catalog of the District College.
 - b. International Baccalaureate (IB): Students who complete the IB Higher Level examinations with scores of 4, 5, 6, or 7 will receive credit for each exam as specified in the catalog of the District College. A score of 4 or higher on the IB Mathematics HL exam will

satisfy the math competency requirement for the associate degree. Students will not receive credit for Standard Level exams.

c. College Level Examination Program (CLEP): Students who earn scores of 50 or higher on a CLEP exam will receive credit for each exam as specified in the catalog of the District College.

II. Internal Departmental Examinations: Internal Credit by Examinations (locally administered tests):

a. Students will receive credit by satisfactory completion of an examination administered by the District College in lieu of completion of a course listed in the college catalog, provided that Credit by Examination is permitted for the course. See the Courses Excluded from Credit by Examination list maintained by each District College. Credit will be awarded with a letter grade and/or P/NP (if the latter is ordinarily available for the course). If a letter grade is awarded, it will be incorporated in the computation of the student's grade point average.

b. A student may be granted credit if he or she satisfactorily passes an examination approved and conducted by the District College discipline faculty. Such credit may be granted only to a student who is registered at the District College and not on either academic probation or progress probation, and only for a course listed in the District College's catalog.

c. The nature and content of the exam shall be determined solely by the District College discipline faculty in accordance with Title 5 Section 55002. The examination must be conducted on the campus of a District College or at a District satellite site.

d. Units for which credit is given pursuant to this provision shall not be counted in determining the 12 semester hours of credit in residence requirement for an associate degree.

e. A District College shall charge a student a fee for administering an examination pursuant to this provision which is equal to the enrollment fee for the course.

III. High School to College Articulation: (Title 5 Section 55051)

High school students may be granted college credit pursuant to established articulation agreements between the high school and a District College. The Board of Trustees shall permit articulated courses to be applied to certificate or associate degree requirements in accordance with this provision. The per-unit fee for high school credit by examination will not be charged. Articulated high school courses may be accepted in lieu of comparable District College courses to partially satisfy:

- a. Certificate requirements, including the total number of units required for the certificate; or
- b. The major or area of emphasis requirements in a degree program.

Students who complete articulated comparable courses must pass an exam to earn college credit for general education and/or major requirements for the associate degree.

CUT SCORES

The number of units awarded for each type of examination is subject to change based on the establishment of cut scores and/or other evaluative measures developed by District college faculty in collaboration with the Academic Senates and /or a CSU Chancellor's Office policy as pursuant to the AB 1985, and /or Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) Standards, Policies and Procedures latest version.

CREDIT FOR EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS (AP, IB, AND CLEP)

- The evaluation of credit for AP, IB, and CLEP examinations is done by a college counselor. Counselors may require additional documentation or information as necessary to determine eligibility for external credit.

- Credit granted for the examinations may be counted as credit toward an associate degree. The **Counseling** faculty at each District College will determine how the credit is used to satisfy general education and major requirements for the associate degree.
- Credit granted for these examinations may also be counted toward the satisfaction of IGETC or CSU-GE areas as allowed by the applicable standards for each form of transfer general education certification.
- Credit awarded for AP, IB, and CLEP examinations shall not impact the student's GPA.
- Students granted credit for AP, IB, or CLEP examinations shall not earn credit toward an associate degree for duplicated college courses.
- Other colleges or universities may have different policies concerning the granting of credit for AP, IB, and CLEP examinations, and will evaluate the examinations based upon their own policies and practices.

CREDIT FOR INTERNAL CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

1. Determination for Eligibility:

- The examination is to be administered prior to the last day of the final examination period.
- The course that the units will apply to must be listed in the college catalog.
- The student must be currently registered and not on academic probation, progress probation, or dismissal at any District College.

2. Receive Credit by Examination:

- The student has not earned college credit in more advanced subject matter, and has not received a grade (A, B, C, D, F, W, CR, P, CRE, NC, ~~or~~ NP, or equivalent), in the course for which he or she is seeking Credit by Examination at a District College or any other educational institutions.
- The appropriate petition (a "Petition for Credit by Examination" form) will be

completed by the student and a college counselor, and forwarded to the appropriate academic division for administration of the examination.

- Petitions must be approved by the division dean and received by the administering instructor no later than Friday of the tenth week of the full-length semester.

3. Units and Grades Recorded for Credit by Examination:

- A student seeking credit by examination will receive the appropriate letter grade (A, B, C, D, F, or P/NP) and will be charged the current enrollment fee per unit regardless of the grade received. Students who are unsuccessful in an attempt to challenge a course by examination will receive a D, F, or NP, and a record of the attempt for credit by examination will appear on a student's transcript.

CREDIT BY EXAMINATION FOR A HIGH SCHOOL ARTICULATED COURSE:

1. Determination for Eligibility :

- The course that the units will apply to must be listed in the college catalog.
- The student must be currently registered at a high school with which a District College has an articulation agreement, ~~an articulated high school~~, and in good standing as defined by their cumulative GPA at a minimum of 2.0 at the time of the Credit by Examination credit granted ~~(as this is defined by that high school)~~.
- The student has not earned college credit in more advance subject matter, and has not received a grade (A, B, C, D, F, W, CR, CRE, NC, ~~or~~ NP, or equivalent), in the course for which he or she is seeking Credit by Examination at a District College or any other educational institutions.

2. Receive Credit by Examination

- The student will apply online to one of the colleges in the VCCCD and create an account in a District tracking system.
- ~~The High School Petition for Credit by Examination with required signatures will be completed at the time the student is enrolled in the equivalent high school course and submitted to the Registrar after the student successfully completes the course.~~
- The student passes the college's course via a comprehensive exam or evaluation determined solely by a District College faculty in the discipline.

3. Units and Grades Recorded:

- Students who are unsuccessful in obtaining a standard grade of C or better will not be allowed to petition for credit, and no record of the attempt for credit by examination will appear on a student's transcript.

LIMITS OF CREDIT BY EXAMINATION (ALL METHODS):

- Students may challenge a given credit-by-examination course only once.
- Credits acquired by examination are not counted in determining the 12 semester units of credit in residence required for an associate degree.
- Students should be aware that other colleges may not accept Credit by Examination for transfer purposes.
- A student should be advised that the use of units granted through credit by examination policy towards establishing eligibility for athletics, financial aid, and veterans' benefits are subject to the rules and regulations of the external agencies involved. (Exceptions to the above may be made when necessary to meet provisions of California state law or the rules and regulations of state agencies governing programs of the California Community Colleges.)
- A student may challenge no more than 12 units under the credit-by-examination policy

towards an associate degree or a certificate of achievement, except that units awarded for AP and IB examinations shall not be subject to such limit.

- Credit by Examination may be granted in only one course in a sequence of courses, as determined by prerequisites, and may not be granted for a course which is a prerequisite to the one in which the student is currently enrolled, except that credit may be granted for more than one course in a sequence of required courses when approved by the administrator or a designee responsible for vocational programs, or where the curriculum in occupational programs makes it necessary.

DOCUMENTATION OF ALLOWABLE CREDIT AWARDS

Each District College shall maintain records of the courses for which units of credit may be granted through Credit by Examination. These records shall be maintained either in the Office of Academic Affairs or in the Student Services Office.

- For use of AP credit in major preparation, refer to ASSIST and/or the transfer college catalog/website.
- Students who have earned credit from an AP exam should not take a comparable college course because transfer credit will not be granted for both.

Rules for use of AP Credit on IGETC.

- A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required to grant credit for GE certification. An acceptable AP score for IGETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes.
- Each AP exam may be applied to one GE area as satisfying one course requirement, with the exception of Language other than English (LOTE). (See Section 10.6.3 of IGETC Standards for more information).
- There is no equivalent AP exam for Critical Thinking/Composition (IGETC 1B/CSU GE A3) requirement. Students earning scores of 3, 4, or 5 in the physical and biological science AP examinations earn credit toward the lecture and meet the laboratory activity requirement.
- AP exams in Biology, Chemistry or Physics B allow CCC campuses to apply 4 semester or 5 quarter units to IGETC certification. For Environmental Science, Physics C: Mechanics, and Physics C: Electricity/Magnetism, 3 semester or 4 quarter units are applied for IGETC certification; therefore, students who complete these exams will be required to complete at least 4 semester or 5 quarter units to satisfy the minimum required units for Area 5.
- Subscore on Calculus BC examination - Students who take the Calculus BC examination and earn a subscore of 3 or higher on the Calculus AB portion will receive credit for the Calculus AB examination, even if they do not receive a score of 3 or higher on the BC examination (note that the maximum credit awarded is 8 quarter units).
- Music Theory subscore – UC grants credit for the full Music Theory exam. Students who earn only a subscore will not receive exam credit.
- There is no limit on the number of external exams that can be applied to IGETC. External exams may be used regardless of when the exam is taken.

Rules for use of AP Credit on CSU GE-BREADTH

- If a student passes more than one AP exam in calculus or computer science, only one examination may be applied to the baccalaureate.
- Students who pass AP Environmental Science earn 4 units of credit. Tests prior to Fall 2009 may apply to either B1+B3 or B2+B3 of GE Breadth. Fall of 2009 or later, those credits may only apply to B1+B3. If a student passes more than one AP exam in physics, only six units of credit may be applied to the baccalaureate, and only four units of credit may be applied to a certification in GE Breadth.

College-Level Examination Program Credit By Examination

Students may earn College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) Credit by Examination with minimum scores of 50 or higher. CLEP credit can be used to meet IGETC, CSU GE, and AA/AS General Education (GE). Students must have the CLEP Organization send the CLEP official results to the Admission and Records Office (hand-carried copies will not be accepted) for use on the AA/AS or GE patterns. Course credit and units grant at Ventura College may differ from course credit and units granted by a receiving institution.

Changing Grades-Determination of Final Grades

The instructor of the course shall determine the grade to be awarded to each student.

The determination of the student's grade by the instructor is final in the absence of mistake, fraud, bad faith, or incompetence. "Mistake" may include, but is not limited to, errors made by an instructor in calculating a student's grade, and clerical errors. "Fraud" may include, but is not limited to, inaccurate recording or change of a grade by any person who gains access to grade records without authorization.

The Evidence/Records of Achievement shall justify the final grade assigned. Instructors are required to keep their grade records for a minimum of three years in accordance with the time limit for a student initiated grade change request. The grade assigned shall be considered to be final and is not subject to reconsideration in the absence of mistake, fraud, bad faith, or incompetency. Each instructor of record may be expected to explain a grade to a student who makes inquiry.

~~The instructor of the course shall determine the grade to be awarded to each student. Grades are assigned as a result of academic assessment made by the instructor of record of the course.~~

Pass/No Pass grade designations, once applied to the transcript, cannot be changed to a letter grade.

The removal or change of an incorrect grade from a student's record shall only be done pursuant to Education Code 76232 and Title 5, Section 55760 or by an alternative method that ensures that each student shall be afforded an objective and reasonable review of the requested grade change.

Student Initiated Grade Change Requests

For student initiated requests for grade changes see AP 5530, Student Rights and Grievances. In all cases of student initiated grade changes, the instructor who first awarded the grade will be

given written notice if a change of grade is made.

The procedure as outlined in AP 5530 requires that a student first request a grade change from the instructor. In cases where the student has filed a discrimination complaint, or if the instructor of record is not available, or where the district determines that there is a possibility of gross misconduct by the original instructor, provisions shall be made to allow another faculty member to substitute for the instructor of record.

The change of grade shall be requested by the student no more than three years after the term in which the grade was awarded. Exceptions to the time limit may be made if it is determined that the grade was awarded as a result of mistake, fraud, bad faith or incompetence by the instructor.

Students may be required to provide documentation to support request for a grade change that may include but is not limited to graded assignments and tests from the class in question or substantiation of verifiable extenuating circumstances.

Instructor Initiated Grade Changes

Faculty initiated grade changes must be approved by a local process and submitted to Admissions & Records with an accompanying written justification for the grade change from a lower to a higher grade. Requests for changing a grade from a higher to a lower grade are prohibited except for exceptional circumstances that must be documented. Faculty initiated grade changes will only be accepted for grades recorded within the previous calendar year.

Except in the case of an incomplete grade, grade changes are not permitted based on coursework submitted after the end of the course.

In the case of fraud, bad faith, or incompetence, the final determination concerning the removal or change of grade will be made by the ~~Executive Vice President~~ Chief Instructional Officer.

In all cases, where means exist and when at all possible, the instructor who first awarded the grade will be given written notice of the change.

Security of Grade Records

The District shall implement security measures for student records that assure no person may obtain access to student grade records without proper authorization.

The measures implemented by the District shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, password protection for all student grade data bases, locking mechanisms for computer stations from which student grade data bases can be viewed, and strict limits on the number of persons who are authorized to change student grades.

Only regular full-time employees of the District may be authorized to change grades. Each college shall keep a list of which persons are authorized to change grades. This list shall be maintained by the Chief Student Services Officer or designee.

Any person who discovers that grades have been changed by someone other than the persons authorized to do so shall notify the Chief Student Services Officer or designee immediately. The Chief Student Services Officer or designee shall immediately take steps to lock the grade storage system entirely while an investigation is conducted. Any student or employee who is

found to have gained access to grade recording systems without proper authorization, or who is found to have changed any grade without proper authority to do so, shall be subject to discipline in accordance with District policies and procedures.

Any person who is found to have gained access to grade recording systems without proper authorization, or who is found to have changed any grade without proper authority to do so, shall be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over the college where the incident occurred.

If any student's grade record is found to have been changed without proper authorization, the District will notify: 1) the student; 2) the instructor who originally awarded the grade; 3) any educational institution to which the student has transferred; 4) the accreditation agency; and 5) appropriate local law enforcement authorities.

Whenever a grade is changed for any reason, corrected transcripts will be sent to any educational institution to which a student has transferred.

Prohibition of Drugs

The unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of alcohol or any controlled substance is prohibited on District property, during District-sponsored field trips, activities or workshops, and in any facility or vehicle operated by the District.

Violation of this prohibition will result in appropriate action up to and including termination of employment, expulsion, and referral for prosecution, or, as permitted by law, may require satisfactory participation in an alcohol or drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program.

As a condition of employment, employees must notify the District within five days of any conviction for violating a criminal drug statute while in the workplace. The District is required to inform any agencies that require this drug-free policy within ten days after receiving notice of a workplace drug conviction.

PROCEDURES FOR PLACING COURSES INTO DISCIPLINE(S)

A. NEW COURSES

1. The author(s) of a new course will have access to a field in Curricunet that will contain a drop-down menu of all disciplines listed in the latest Minimum Qualifications Handbook, developed by ASCCC and approved by the Board of Governors. They will select one or more disciplines for the particular course. Faculty teaching such a course will have to meet the minimum qualifications for one of the selected disciplines, or go through the local equivalency process.
2. The author(s) will fill out the form for departmental approval of the course (required for new courses). The form will have the selected disciplines listed, and the department submitting the course must approve the selected discipline(s) for the course.
3. The Curriculum Technical Review Workgroup will make sure that the selected discipline(s) are appropriate for the course content submitted.
4. The Curriculum Committee will have a separate item agendaized for approval of the selected discipline(s) for courses.
5. A two-thirds approval vote shall be required for the assignment of discipline(s) to a course that is not prima facie.

B. REVISED and UPDATED COURSES

1. The author(s) of a course revision will have access to a field in Curricunet that will contain a drop-down menu of all disciplines listed in the latest Minimum Qualifications Handbook, developed by the ASCCC and approved by the Board of Governors. They will verify that the discipline(s) previously selected for the course are still valid, and make adjustments as necessary to make course content changes. Only faculty in the discipline(s) in which the course is presently assigned shall be allowed to propose changes (i.e., additions or deletions) to the discipline(s) existing on the course outline of record. If any change is made to the discipline field, the department shall communicate the rationale for the changes to the Curriculum Committee in a memo.
2. The Curriculum Technical Review Workgroup will make sure that the selected discipline(s) are appropriate for the revised course content submitted.
3. The Curriculum Committee will have a separate item agendaized for approval of the selected discipline(s) for courses.
4. A two-thirds approval vote shall be required for the assignment of discipline(s) to a course that is not prima facie.

C. CHANGES TO STATE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS HANDBOOK

In the event that a change affecting a course discipline occurs (change in course discipline minimum qualifications, creation of a new discipline, and/or deletion of a discipline):

1. The department(s) that have discipline(s) that are currently listed on the Course Outline of Record (COR) will review the state handbook changes, and make any necessary changes to the course outline (course update).
2. The Curriculum Technical Review Workgroup will make sure that any changes are appropriate for the course content of the updated course.
3. The Curriculum Committee will have a separate item agendized for approval of the selected discipline(s) changes for courses.
4. A two-thirds approval vote shall be required for the assignment of discipline(s) to a course that is not prima facie.

The passage of the Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act (SB 1440) and the Common Course Numbering System (SB 1415) strengthened the transfer pathway and the course articulation process. Under the auspices of this legislation, Academic Senates for the California Community Colleges (ASCCC) and the California State University approved statewide Transfer Model Curricula (TMC) as a means of establishing a common structure to the major component of Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs). The Course Identification Numbering System (C-ID) defines the required courses in a TMC, and colleges developing ADT degrees are required to obtain C-ID designations for those courses.

Since July 1, 2015, the Chancellor's Office required that courses included in an ADT that have a C-ID designation must contain courses with a finalized C-ID descriptor and must have been reviewed and approved by C-ID prior to submitting the ADT for approval.

Due to delays in the approval process of some C-ID courses, there have been challenges approving a number of ADTs in a timely manner. Hence, there has been significant feedback from the field to the Chancellor's Office and ASCCC regarding this issue. As a result, the colleges who have not been able to obtain C-ID course approvals have not been able to offer these ADTs, which prohibits transfer opportunities for community college students.

POLICY CHANGE

The Chancellor's Office in collaboration with ASCCC have developed a new policy to implement the approval of ADTs, which aligns with Resolution number 15.02 F16 "Approval of Associate Degrees", adopted at the 2016 ASCCC Fall Plenary Session. This policy change allows the inclusion of courses that have been submitted to and are under C-ID review to be included in an ADT submission to the Chancellor's Office.

Thus, the new policy is as follows: ADTs in which courses pending C-ID approval over 45 days may be included in the degree if the program application demonstrates evidence that those courses has been submitted to and are under review in the C-ID System (e.g., submitted, resubmitted, in progress, conditional and/or approved). Thus, for evidence, please submit a screenshot from the C-ID website that includes the date of submission, course name, and college. This new ADT policy will take effect on March 1, 2017. ADT proposals in the queue before March 1 that do not have final C-ID approval will be returned and colleges must resubmit with either C-ID course approval or provide evidence that demonstrates that responses to C-ID submissions are taking more than 45 days. This does not negate the requirement of C-ID approval and colleges should continue to pursue their efforts to obtain C-ID approval.

Currently, the Chancellor's Office requires colleges to check "yes" in the current curriculum inventory system at the radio button indicating that the "College has submitted all courses with C-ID descriptors to C-ID for review, which certifies the college is not submitting ADTs without C-ID final approval of required courses of the ADT." With this new policy, the colleges that have pending C-ID approval for courses over 45 days may click "yes. "

As the Chancellor's Office continues its work on streamlining curriculum and builds a new curriculum inventory system called Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory (COCI), the checked box field will not be necessary.
