Kenneth C. Green is the founding director of The Campus Computing Project, which is the largest continuing study of the role of eLearning, and information technology in American higher education. The project is widely cited as a definitive source for data, information, and insight about IT planning and policy issues affecting US colleges and universities. Green is the author or editor of some 20 books and published research reports and more than 100 articles and commentaries in academic and professional publications. He also serves as the senior research Higher Ed. In 2002 Green received the first EDUCAUSE award for leadership in public policy and practice. The EDUCAUSE award cites his work in creating The Campus Computing Project and recognizes his "prominence in the arena of national and international technology agendas, and the linking of higher education to those agendas." In 2012, EdTech Magazine cited Green's DigitalTweed blog, published by Inside Higher Ed, as one of the "50 must read higher ed IT blogs."
