Background

As a child growing up in Cuba, I was fascinated by *Santería*, also known as *Regla de Ocha*, or *Lucumí*, its history in the Caribbean, and its trajectory to the United States. *Santería* originated in Cuba as a combination of the West Africa's Yoruba religion and Catholicism. Cuba's prevailing religion is Christianity, primarily Roman Catholic, although in some instances it has been profoundly modified and influenced through syncretism.

The creation of this new religion in Western culture developed as a necessity for the African slaves to hide their worshipping deities from the Catholic priests whose goal was to convert them to Catholicism. These slaves were now faced with a new challenge; how to pray to their African gods and still survive. The answer was to create African deities that reflected the same qualities as those of Catholic saints.

Purpose of Sabbatical Project

The purpose of my proposed sabbatical is to develop an educational bridge to students seeking cultural knowledge while reflecting on the cultural impact and practices within the Latino and Anglo-Saxon communities in the United States. I intend to link this project to courses offered by the Sociology, History, and Political Science departments thus creating a sense of respect, tolerance and acceptance.

- Religious ramifications
- Urban growth in America
